

ST. NICHOLAS NIGHT A CCSS READER'S THEATER & CLOSE READING TOOLKIT By: Erin Beers

WHY READER'S THEATER?

Reader's Theater is one of my favorite tools to utilize in my 6th grade classroom. While I have listed the 4-7 grade common core standards that this package covers, Reader's Theater directly improves fluency and comprehension with any level. In addition, Reader's Theater allows students the opportunity to climb inside of a character and perform. While you can read through a passage just one time, students gain a greater understanding and build fluency when read multiple times.

DIRECTIONS:

- Copy the passage and extension activities for students.
- Give students 2-5 minutes to preview the passage and determine which character they might like to perform
- Based on class size, you may be able to have two different groups perform the same play.
- Display characters/parts in the classroom for students to see.
- I pull Popsicle sticks with student names to make character selection most fair. As I pull a student's name, they get to pick which part they would like
- I then write the student's name next to the character/part as a reminder.
- Once all parts have been selected, I give students another 2-5 minutes to scan through to locate their part.
- Finally, begin the passage. Read aloud as many times as you find suitable for your students.
- Answer Reader Response Questions, complete Context Clue Word Work, complete Journal Prompt, and Summary Organizer.

Trevor: (<u>lightheartedly</u>) We see how it is, Mrs. Gallen! Go ahead with your newsflash!


Mrs. Gallen: (intensely) You know how every year our town has St. Nicholas Night?

Mrs. Gallen: What you may or may not have paid attention to is the fact that our high school band follows behind St. Nicholas' sleigh in a trolley and plays holiday music to **enhance** the spirit of the night. Winston: (interjecting) The band members are usually freezing their tails off because it is a really cold night. Mrs. Gallen: (amused) That is true, but the exciting news I have for you is that this year because our high school students have a prior commitment performing downtown at the ice skating rink, this band class now gets to be the group performing in the trolley following behind St. Nicholas. What do you think? **Skylar:** I think we have some holiday songs to practice... **Winston:** I think I have some warmer clothes to buy! **Trevor:** (oblivious) Mrs. Gallen, my family just moved to Milan this summer, so I have no clue what you are talking about! Can you share a little more about St. Nicholas Night? Mrs. Gallen: Of course, Trevor. You fit so seamlessly into this group that I forget you haven't been here since kindergarten like many of the others. St. Nicholas Night is special event that our town celebrates, but it has been celebrated all across Europe for years. Many North American cities, like ours with large populations of people of German descent, also carry on the St. Nicholas tradition. St. Nicholas was a real Greek saint from the 4th century. Journal Response:

Student responses should incorporate information about a tradition celebrated and specific details about the occasion. Students will also explain the importance of celebrating this specific tradition with their own family. I evaluate students using a 4-point scale.

Summary:

Mrs. Gallen wanted to share some exciting news about St. Nicholas Night with her students, but they were preoccupied with complaining about it. So, finally she was able to share the news that the high school band would not be able to participate by playing in the St. Nick Night festivities. Then her students were a bit more enthusiastic about St. Nick Night because they would be able to perform.

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
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


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
